Camp Director • Scott Kneifl Wayne State Head Volleyball Coach

Scott Kneifl has coached the Wayne State College volleyball team for the last 14 seasons, guiding the Wildcats to an impressive 344-124 record (.735) during that time including a 196-74 mark in Northern Sun Conference games.

Kneifl coached the Wildcats to a 22-9 record in 2018, including a 13-7 mark in the rugged Northern Sun Conference. WSC led the NSIC in blocks per set (2.56), which tied for sixth in NCAA Division II, and led the NSIC in opponent attack percentage (.151).

Under Kneifl in 2015, the Wildcats made school history by winning the NCAA Central Regional and advancing to the Elite Eight for the first time. WSC beat Carson-Newman (Tenn.) in the national quarterfinals before falling to Palm Beach Atlantic in the Final Four, ending the season with a 28-8 record. The Wildcats were third in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll.

Kneifl has led Wayne State College to 11 NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances in his 14 years with the Wildcats while coaching five All-Americans (Emily Schroeder in 2006 and '07, Jennifer Hefner in 2009 and '10 and Alyssa Frauendorfer in 2015). He is a two-time NSIC Coach of the Year (2005, 2009) and has led the Wildcats to 13 20+ win seasons in his 14 years as head coach.

WSC Assistant Coach Kim DePew

Kim DePew (Edwards)

enters her 11th year as an assistant coach with the Wayne State College volleyball program. The Sioux City (lowa) Heelan High School graduate coaches the setters for the Wildcats while also handling recruiting duties and camp coordinator responsibilities. Before coming to WSC, DePew (Edwards) served two seasons as a graduate assistant coach at Emporia



State in Kansas where she was a standout setter. She was a First Team All-MIAA selection as a senior, recording a league-best 1.489 assists.

WSC Coaching Assistant Katie Morris

Katie Morris is in her third year as a Volleyball Coaching Assistant at Wayne State College. A former Wildcat vol-

leyball standout, Katie (Hughes) Morris is one of just seven players in school history to record 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs during her playing career from 2012-15. She currently ranks third in career digs (1,924) and 15th in career kills (1,177).

Morris was a First Team All-NSIC selection as a senior in 2015, recording 20 double-doubles while averaging 3.57 kills and 4.74 digs per set. She helped the Wildcats to a



28-8 record as a senior, winning the schools' first-ever NCAA Central Region title and trip to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Morris was a four-year starter during her Wildcat career.
